This presentation reports on a collaborative project at UTAS between Pharmacy academics and Learning Skills Advisers aimed at better understanding the challenges that students face in relation to the assessable oral communication components of the Bachelor of Pharmacy program.

In the past, the failure of some UTAS Pharmacy students on work experience placements was often attributed to poor oral communication skills.

From 2013, and with demonstrable success, academic staff and language advisers have worked together to design, deliver and evaluate a program of communication skills and work-related vocab embedded into the year 2 and 3 units of the Bachelor of Pharmacy course.
